Success

The Problem

- Needed to cut IT costs by 10% without impacting service level
- Network Manager and Controller managed 20+ Move, Add, Change, and Disconnections (MACDs) and 600+ accounts every month
- Facilities dealt with telecom vendors directly, eroding purchasing power and increasing costs unnecessarily
